

Hand sanitizer is an irritant to eyes and mucous membranes. Prolonged exposure to vapor may irritate the skin. Repeated and prolonged contact of the gel with the skin may cause dryness.

Hand sanitizer can be toxic if ingested or swallowed. It can cause gastrointestinal irritation, narcosis and injury to the kidneys and liver.

Due to the risks associated with hand sanitizers, hand sanitizer must be kept out of the reach of the children and must be dispensed with adult supervision.

To use hand sanitizer:

- Apply product to the palm of one hand
- Rub hands together
- Rub the product over all surfaces of hand and fingers until hands are dry.
